OREGON STATE UNIVERSITY, CORVALLIS. The Geography Program of the College of Earth, Ocean, and Atmospheric Sciences invites applications for a 9-month position as a full-time Instructor in Geographic Information Science. We seek a dedicated Instructor who is passionate about teaching and who will complement and enhance the Geography Program's outstanding reputation for undergraduate and graduate instruction. The primary purpose of this position is to deliver nine courses per year (quarter calendar) in the area of geographic information science (GIS), including GIS programming and analysis. Courses taught include lower and upper division courses, in classroom (face-to-face) and online (e-campus) settings. The position also includes direction of student research projects and internships, serving on graduate student committees (optional), and service. Candidates must have a MA or MS in geography or a closely related field with teaching experience at the post-secondary level, and a demonstrated commitment to teaching excellence. Demonstrated expertise in Geographic Information Systems (GIS) programming is required. The successful applicant must be committed to educational equity in a multicultural setting and must show a commitment to advancing the participation of diverse groups and supporting diverse perspectives. A PhD in geography or a closely related discipline and experience in advising and course development is highly preferred. OSU is an AA/EOE and the College of Earth, Ocean, and Atmospheric Sciences is committed to promoting diverse perspectives and approaches to research and education. Applications from members of historically underrepresented groups are strongly encouraged. The anticipated start date is September 16, 2013. Salary is competitive, and benefits package includes several options for health/dental/life insurance, retirement, as well as a new program of reduced tuition for dependents (some restrictions apply).
