The program provides **up to three scholars** with a comfortable office, a \$1,500 stipend, staff, IT support and software, and other research support in a collaborative and welcoming environment. During the residency, researchers will meet regularly to share their progress with one another.

## **Eligibility:**

- Full-time UI faculty or staff members
- Ability to work full-time during the residency
- Willingness to participate in orientation and work-in-progress discussions

Project work may involve grant development, data collection or curation, manuscript writing and dissemination, or other phases of the research process.

The program provides **up to two scholars** with a comfortable office, a \$1,500 stipend, staff and IT support, software, focus group development, and other research support in a collaborative and welcoming environment.
