- b. The paper (Jae-On Kim, Jin Wang and Sanghag Kim) --“Constructing a Basic Index of National Power,” is under review for journal publication.
- c. Another article is under progress with Sanghag Kim, that deals with composite index construction for “human development.” This is an off-shoot from the National Power Index project. We project to finish this article during the Spring semester and to submit it to Social Indicators Journal. It deals with familiar issues in index construction and factor analysis, but which are not either well-known or violated in practice. It deals with both theoretical and practical issues.
- d. Dimensionality of Affective Meaning Project:

I have been working on the examination of the underlying assumption of the Affect Control Theory, namely that we need only three fundamental dimensions (Evaluation, Power, and Activity) in studying social identities and activities related to these identities. To challenge this assumption, I have collected with my Korean colleagues several data sets, which replicated original surveys of Osgood et al (which became the foundation of ACT protocol), with some modifications. The Osgood procedure requires two stage (distinct) surveys: (1) to collect adjectives that are most often used to describe 100 objects or identities and then construct 50 bi-polar scales out of these adjectives; (2) to collect factor analysis data using these 50 scales and the 100 identities. In order to collect the adjectives, we used two procedures – one exactly the same procedure as Osgood used and the other using 44 social identities, instead of his original 100, which contained a very limited number of social identities. In selecting 50 bi-polar scales, we have used and combined the results of these two different surveys. Then we collected the factor analysis data.

As expected, these Korean data revealed that the three dimensions (EPA) are inadequate to fully represent the affective meanings of social identities. Most importantly, the original evaluation dimension does not fully distinguish the differences between primary, intimate, kinship-related social identities and others – the differences between *Gemeinschaft* and *Gesellschaft*. Korean and American surveys clearly revealed that we need to consider at least two evaluation dimensions – one dealing with familiarity and sociability (a sense of being close and comfortable) and the other dealing with general competence. Part of the results of Korean survey is published in Korean Journal of Sociology as a lead article.

With the help of UI internal grant, Wang Jin and I have collected Chinese data, which had one distinct feature: from the beginning the adjectives are collected on the basis of 100 social identities. (In contrast, we have used Osgood et al’s 100 objects and supplemented that survey with survey involving 44 social identities in Korea.) The preliminary analysis of Chinese data indicates that we may need even more dimensions of evaluation. In order to see whether social identities in general span a more complex meaning space or it is a reflection of China’s unique culture, we need to replicate the full surveys in other countries.

So I have started collecting new Korean data sets, using 100 social identities. We will then have to carry out the second stage survey. When we were doing the original Korean surveys, the assumption of the universality of the EPA dimensions was so strong that all we needed to was to find whether such assumption was supported. Since such assumption is proven unfounded, and we know by now that the set of identities you start with might have radical implications about the dimensionality of affective meaning associated with them, we need to replicate the Osgood et al’s

work as well as surveys based solely on social identities. I hope to collect all these new data sometime this year, and to write a definitive paper on the dimensionality of affective meaning of social identities. I also hope to secure some external grant to carry out the replication of these surveys in the US.

Professors Myoung-Jin Lee and Setbyol Choi from Korea and Prof. Jin Wang from China were planning to join me at Iowa, but they could not get the necessary leave. So we meeting this coming Summer in Seoul, where I will be staying from June 10 to August 10. We hope to draft a couple of books together. These books are supposed to be done by the end of the 2008 academic year.
